Process

Method description

During the first five months of this studio, I have already consciously and subconsciously engaged with the research questions above. There thus already exists a body of work to base the continuation of the project on. The first phase of the project leading up to the P1 was dedicated to research of the city of Maastricht in according to the theme of "The Migrant City". The second half of the semester was dedicated to the design of a masterplan for the Sappi site, which has given me a thorough understanding of the historical layers and present conditions of the site.

The research side of the studio will result in a written paper that addresses the theme the "in transit condition" in Maastricht. It will be based on interviews with expats, reading of relevant theory as well as observations on site which will be documented in drawings. The process has been and will be plastic and adaptable depending on the direction that the work requires.

The design work will be a laboratory for the discoveries that are made in the research, trying out different options in a concrete setting. This will be done in diagrams, drawing and models.

Literature and general practical preference

Below I have added a list of sources that I have been reading so far or that I intend to read. Generally they can be divided into three categories. Firstly there are the sources that speak of the city and the postmodern condition on a theoretical level. These include authors like Rossi, Koolhaas, Harvey, Brand, etc. The history and present conditions of the site is investigated through publications by local historians such as Jongenelen and Veldeke as well as through publications by the municipality. Lastly, architectural presedents will be analysed. These include the transformation of the Sphinx factory into The Student Hotel as well as le Corbusiers project for the la Tourette monastery.

 - 1. In architectural terms the focus of the project is closely related to the question: What do we keep? What structures remain relevant under new conditions and what is redundant? How do we approach the grey zone between keeping and demolishing? A close reading of the site, in accordance with the theme of glaneurs/glaneuses permeates the project.
 - In a larger context, I think that the project can be seen in an arch of work that goes through my master years. It addresses several themes that were part of previous work as well. This includes the territorial analysis of the Beemster polder (AR1A061) and the Basel borderland (AR2A011), reflective texts written in the architectural philosophy course (AR2AT041), as well as a housing project for elderly in Tanthof (AR2016). All of these were in different ways dealing with temporal aspects of architecture, on which this graduation project again takes a new angle.
 - 2. The "in-transit condition" can be seen as part of the globalization process that the world is in. The situation that Maastricht is in is certainly not unique, it is similar to many other cities in western Europe. It's industries are declining, and instead it is investing in the knowledge economy and tourism, largely depending on the historical appeal of the city centre. A case study of how an architectural project could be designed in this context should therefore be relevant in many other situations.
