


Average growth rates of 20 OECD countries, 1972-2010








Global overall debts, 2000–2014














Land surface needed for the self-sufficient supply of 60.000 people. $A = 150\text{ km}^2$




Land surface needed for the self-sufficient supply of 1.000 people. $A = 2,5\text{ km}^2$
