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



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


Urban sprawl: a common problem with different characteristics between the US & Europe






Research question




What is the respective roles of local and regional characteristics of urban form on vehicle travel?

Results from two case studies: San Francisco Bay Area, CA and Randstad Area, NL

	San Francisco	Randstad
Built Environment > travel distance	✓	✓
Built Environment > trip frequency	X	X
Neighbourhood (node density) > travel distance (local action space)	•	✓
City (jobs accessibility) > travel distance (regional action space)	✓	✓
Travel distance (local/regional)	1/5.7	1/5.0

Multilevel (MLM), ordered logit models (ORL)

Evidence suggests that we promote planning on **both spatial scales**, though with **priority to the regional leve**l to make VKT reduction policies more effective.
