





Personal belongings, wilderness or 'free nature' was seen as neglected and needed to be habitable.






#### What if?

#### **Biophilic Design**

Restore the connection with nature by creating experiences of nature through buildings and spaces that are beneficial for people's health and well-being; considering people as part of nature

"Biophilia [...] is the innately emotional affiliation of human beings to other livings organisms." - Edward O. Wilson (1984)

#### **NATURE IN THE** SPACE

NATURE INCORPORATION

Bring in or artificially create natural elements, phenomena, and processes, and emphasize them through multi-sensory experiences.

#### NATURAL **ANALOGUES**

NATURE INSPIRATION

Imitate nature (biomimicry) and evoke the sense of nature through the delicate placement of natural features.

#### **NATURE OF THE** SPACE

NATURE INTERACTION

Arrange spaces based on evolved human-nature relationships to experience nature-like environments and establish connections with the natural system or between various spaces.

#### **Active Movement & Improve Access to Natural Areas**

The immediate residential environment greatly impacts daily life, with 5 to 20 minutes of outdoor nature immersion boosting positive emotions and mental wellbeing. Designing neighborhoods for active movement and easy access to nature encourages daily outdoor time and social interactions (Terrapin Bright Green, 2014; Sim, 2019).






#### **Redefine Boundaries - Courtyards & Streets**




Transforming the existing buildings and densifying courtyards can enhance urban structure and foster a stronger sense of ownership.

Creating sightlines and interactions between these zones can spark curiosity and exploration, encouraging movement and boosting spontaneous social interactions (Heath et al., 2021).




Residents' ability to regulate privacy is crucial for social interactions (Altman, 1975). Insufficient privacy regulation can lead to missed social opportunities, loneliness, crowding-related stress, and anonymity. Designing environments with clearly defined zones for different social interactions is essential for fostering meaningful connections (Van Dorst, 2005).


# The Outdoor Living Room





### **Hybrid Shared Spaces - Retreat**



#### characteristics:

- nooks (secluded space)
- darker/softer colours
- sound absorbing materials
- plants & flowers with a light scent that stimulates relaxation
- white noise (animals / wind/leaves)
- touch of nature
- semi-outdoor (become part of the outdoor space in summer)
- privacy screen (semi-open)
- oriented towards retreat outdoor spaces













- 2m wide connecting wooden walkway, adds to feeling of home & warmth

- private outdoor space in niches and darker tone of wood


















