

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NEW BRIEF + STUDY TRIP Week 2.1 13/11-17/11

Week overview.

Research seminar: We have visited two libraries on a study trip, both being a subject to retrofitting of existing buildings. The library Predikherenklooster in Mechelen - Belgium was an inspiring conversion of an old monastery. The sensitive approach in which the building was renovated is astonishing. The building was treated with respect and consequence which shows. What I mean with respect is the decision to preserve the current state of paint and minimal intervention to the structure of the building and that would be the attic which is fully exposed. Not only this shows a big respect towards the craftsmen behind the stucco and marvellous roof structure. The decision to leave the old paintwork as it is also pays respect to the major craftsmen involved with this project which is the pass of time itself. Interestingly the architectural intervention to the object is so subtly done that the most expression of the architect went into fitting the custom furniture and letters. Overall I am impressed with the project itself. I believe the building does what is being asked from it and from a library in a well executed and professional manner. One might critique it for being just a boring library and its only mixed use is cafe and restaurant which are rather separated from the main library. I personally do not see it as a bad comment as it takes a certain skill and design discipline to execute what is being expected from a space in a well working manner. On the contrary the LocHal is a very different object. The space is lively and vibrant, but noisy and disruptive too. I see myself studying better in Predikherenklooster. But, when it comes to an inspiring modern space an incubator of ideas but also a space where the studying goes beyond traditional "having nose in a book" and goes into the forms of digital, video, learning from others, discussing and debating - LocHal is a space where I'd go to. LocHal also had a very different object at its disposition, an ex train fixing warehouse for NS which provides radically different spatial conditions. In that sense comparing both with proves to be an resourceful exercise. Where the Stockholm City Library provides similar quality to the Predikherenklooster it won't

provide what LocHal has to offer.

Design studio: New brief was introduced. On top of that we have been collectively working on the material necessary for the whole studio. My self I have been working on the floor plans and cleaning them up.

In regards to the brief the task seems overwhelming. Especially when I studied the two other briefs which proposed in my opinion an overly ambitious programme for the building. They managed to go for tens of pages about what they want to create but at the same time it was not very specific and concise. In a sense the 2006 brief was specific but in my opinion it stated a programme based on guess work not necessarily explained why it has such programme. The 2014 brief did not state a programme but instead proposed in my opinion a wish list almost like a child writing and asking about a Christmas present. The similarity does not end here, as in my opinion the "child" asked for a present impossible to deliver by specifying for ages what they want not minding in fact the actual size of the building at the same time putting significant constrains.





INITIAL IDEASWEEK 2.2 20/11-24/11

Week overview.


Research seminar: Lecture by Daniel from DRDH was an inspiring one. I particularly enjoyed the sensitivity to historic context in which his interventions are embedded and the link that they create. The connection of the building to the history of the place is in my opinion somehow enriching. It puts a layer to buildings depth. This was quite specific to the competition entry the studio submitted for St Gallen City Library where the entry was inspired by the gate tower that existed there before. At the same time I acknowledge it is important not to attach oneself strongly to historic inspirations as one might come up with new and much more successful idea detached from history of the site. The case of a Sidcup Storyteller library, cinema and café located near London is an interesting one too. I see the reason behind making a library a mixed use building and combining it with residential project and a cinema. But it also makes me question the system. My understanding is that we live in times where we as a society are more technologically advanced and rich than ever before in a history. So I wonder how it is possible that the state cannot afford projects like just a library and sees them as an expense and sees the need to make a library cost neutral. I do not critique the idea itself as for me at least at first glance it works well. However it is weird that the state in our day and age is not rich enough just to be able to finance public program from taxes. Maybe this is a question of scale? If the state wants more libraries then they need to be profitable or cost neutral at least. Or maybe the question lies in unfair taxation of big companies? As it seem weird that in the time of Google, Microsoft, McDonalds, Coca-cola, 711 where we have companies with budgets of entire countries the state cannot afford a public library. In my opinion it is even ludicrous. At the same time it makes me question the case of Stockholm library too. Somehow the idea that the McDonalds and 711 are located in the Bazar buildings is amusing. One might think that their contribution from taxation should be enough to keep them out of public buildings - that they won't be needed to pay for the upkeep of a public

institution. It also places a question whether the state should operate as a corporation and be profitable or whether the state is responsible for serving the society and it is natural that it bares the expanses of it not tries to make it lucrative.


Design studio: I tried to build on top of the existing briefs which are introduced on the right side. Minding the requirements of both briefs trying to formulate my own proved to be challenging. The 2014 brief in my opinion builds on top of the 2006 brief but adds the modern touch. In fact because of that in my opinion the required programme only grows instead of shrinking even though the brief from 2014 says it should be smaller.

At the same time it is important to look at the brief from the 2003 perspective. The mentioned in the 2014 brief idea of Stockholm being an international city of many languages only became more relevant today. Former Soviet block countries joining the EEA allowing for economic migration and the refugee crisis that followed meant that many new cultures arrived to the city. With that the social inequality has grown as more migrants and refugees arrived in the city.

I believe that this has to be addressed in the modern library as previously mentioned by me in my take on the libraries in Krakow. Libraries could help the people to study and regain their role in the society and help them to explore their true potential and passions through further education and recognition of their diplomas. More than that for a healthy and egalitarian society it is important that the people have equal opportunities. Here is where the library and librarian plays its role. Librarians are needed the most for the children from more deprived backgrounds (Sillars, 2016). Access to a computer, quiet and warm space to study are things many of us take for granted but not everyone is so lucky in that regard.

INITIAL MASS Week 2.3 27/11-01/12

And the posed questions were:

- 1. What can local- and even radical grassroots libraries offer that central libraries cannot?
- 2. How do the politics of inclusion/exclusion feed into this?
- 3. How do libraries function as 'infrastructure', both socially, and informationally?
- 4. To what extent is the 'hardware' of the library (e.g. its books and spaces) relevant in a digital age?

The debate that followed the reading posed interesting questions. First one regarding the importance of the main library opposed to the importance of local libraries. The valid point were that in fact the local libraries are at a disadvantage towards their collection as they most likely would not have as rich collections as main libraries. But this could be solved by redistribution of goods through various programmes or deliveries. There was also an idea that local libraries are able to serve the communities better which I agree with as they are closer to them. Nonetheless I like the image of a central library. Mainly because it is a statement - the position a state takes on a role of education within a society and it is materialized

in a piece of a building. Of course this position is more than just a building it is the policies, the culture, the legislation but in my opinion people value what they see and there is no better way to express those intentions then in an object.

Second question regarding whether a library should have a more social role was a hard one for me. I think that the main job of a library is to be able to educate and protect the venerable with the means of offering a space exactly for education. There was an idea that a library could be a space where addicts come for help. I believe that there might be a danger of trying to do from a library too much and not being able to allow it to concentrate on its sole task. I sometimes feel like in the spark of ideas we get excited about what a building can do on top of its intention and eventually we forget that there are institutions which do it already.

Third question regarded the death of a physical book. It was argued that digital books would replace soon the physical book. Interesting arguments came out also towards sustainability. Eventually, we were not able to determine which is more sustainable. I think after the discussion it was clear that nor digital, nor physical book would be dead and it is important to make space for digital books. One of the reasons is that they are able to provide access to archival materials without damaging them therefore democratizing this materials as previously only scholars could access. Interestingly in all discussions role of a librarian was overlooked.



They showed the progress of construction of the library, the row of houses which led to the children entrance and were demolished to make room for the park, the drum of the rotund exposed from the Odengatan, and an interesting building on a hill. 





SEARCHING FOR FORM Week 2.4 04/12-08/12

Week overview.

Still not being entirely sure on the appropriate form of my building I decided to carry on more research into the site history. The photos show that the area was previously densely built up with probably working class housing and workshops at the back. The backs of the houses where those workshop are located cut into the hill what creates this interesting phenomenon where the hill is being consumed - almost like it is more of an interruption then of actual value. Asplund sees the case differently and in his masterplan he sees the possibility to use the hill as a park and a gesture for the people making an actual use of it. However I wonder whether his gesture is not only for the privileged classes. Seeing how densely built up the hill is the decision to build a park means displacing many families of their homes and source of income. Looking at the photos I also realise that once the park was a fully functioning urban fabric. Additionally some photos suggest that the slopes of the hills are man-made. This can be seen on photos which show rubble on the slopes - possibly the leftover rubble from the demolition of the buildings on the site to build the Stockholm City Library. Now this presents an interesting argument when it comes to building back in the park as 100 years ago this space looked nothing like it does today.


Putting the exhibition together was a nice break of a weekly routine. It helped to appreciate the work done one the model and it was incredibly nice seeing all the people admiring it.







Week overview.

This week was the opportunity to have a last tutorial before the holiday break. I also took the opportunity and scanned the drawings to archive them here on the project journal and act on the feedback I was given this previous week. The drawings are also a good way of showing this feedback graphically. As they are organised chronologically they show a journey from more concept and large scale thinking into the smaller and more careful scale.

They main issue I was concerned with is the form of my building. In a sense I wanted it to feel natural and organic in its context. That is why the existing photos from the site help as they give me some base and inspiration towards my new shape. Another suggestion for the shape that I found was the existing topography and landscaping – which lines guided my design. Overall the shape of the building from a long stripe resulted into two forms which are split into two by an existing path. The buildings cascade both in plan and section taking the inspiration from the buildings which were already there. The decision to place my building in the park is explained in the diagrams below. The building creates a sort of an axis between the school of economics and the library – additionally guiding the people towards the only path and entrance to the hill. This way in my view the building actually complements scheme. I cannot however say that it does it in a subtle way. Even though the actual size and footprint or even form that I think of is not necessarily controversial – the placement of the building is – as it takes already limited green space from the city itself. A counter argument would be that the building itself and its actual footprint is rather





This week was more for clearing the head and not thinking about the project. It was advised on the last tutorial to actually step away from it and think of different things so we can come with fresh approach.







Week overview.

A general comment made was that we create longitudinal spaces of similar qualities to those created in the library already. I came across precedent which very skilfully created distinctive spaces within rectangular building.








WORKING TOWARDS P2 WEEK 2.9 22/01-26/01

Week overview.



P2 WEEK 2.10 29/12-03/12

Week overview.

The P2 was overall a success as it was a pass. The feedback to quote in full:

NOTES:

Your extension of the Stockholm City Library literally takes a different direction compared to many other proposals. However, you give a strong argumentation for your design proposal, using archival photographs that shows how streets with small buildings once occupied the hill next to the library, before this area was reconstructed as a natural landscape. Your model and hand sketches suggest a convincing intervention, with lots of architectural potentials.

Your building proposal takes a somewhat ambivalent position between being a building that extends the plinth of Asplunds library and an elaborated retaining wall that is part of the landscape of the hill. While this ambiguity in itself can become a quality, it immediately raises questions that need to be adressed. What will be the relation between the roof on which the light boxes are places and the interior space underneath this roof? Are there connections between the two, such as visual, infrastructural (stairs) and regarding their character? Further, the connection between the accesible roof and the space in front of the pond still seems unresolved. Will there be stairs or a ramp and where should these be positioned? Also, the character of the three lightboxes needs careful consideration. The reference to SOM's New Haven library is a bit questionable, since it is not sure if the thin stone panels used there will be as translucent as you suggest.


In that regard the feedback was fruitful and posed a lot of interesting questions for further design. I believe that the quality of my building being the extension of the plinth and the retaining wall should be further delved on. It poses interesting questions about the quality of the interior. Would it be cave like as it is buried on the ground and covered by the hill or would it be illuminated because of the lanterns on top. The material of the light boxes is also to be determined. At the P2 stage I suggested

frosted glass. The SOM beinecke library was indeed an inspiration for me. Because of the idea of the library bringing the knowledge to the populace like a light house (or library of Alexandria) navigating the way or like Prometheus bringing fire to mankind stimulating progress are powerful metaphors. Similar metaphor is used in the central dome of Asplund's library with the bright, tall walls. An issue that is being posed by using semi-transparent material is the fact that the lanterns would block the view out and onto the hill. The issue which I still struggle with and that is not resolved completely and logically is whether the lanterns should be only lanterns or also study spaces and if one or the other should one enter through them. I lean towards a strong no in regards of entrance. I think in a sense the less entrances the more controlled the building as well as the experience of it. If one in fact thinks of a building as a journey and an experience bit like a movie then in fact controlling the path.














3D diagram of my building with highlighted in dark black basements and metro indicating obstacles my project has to deal with


