

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## Reflection

1. What is the relation between your graduation (project) topic, the studio topic (if applicable), your master track (A,U,BT,LA,MBE), and your master programme (MSc AUBS)?

The project Dissolving Distinction focusses on creating a city that is part of nature. The studio, Urban Ecology & Ecocities, focusses, as the name already suggests, on the ecology of cities and its ecosystems. This is one of the main aspects of the graduation topic as well. The link with the master track Urbanism can be found in the context of the project, which is the city, and the outcome of the project, which will be an urban design. The goal is to encourage sustainable development within the built environment, linking to the master programme of MSc AUBS.

2. What is the relevance of your graduation work in the larger social, professional and scientific framework.

The changing climate in combination with urbanization leads to challenges within the urban environment. The consequences of climate change are already visible in the city and form a threat. Therefore, there is a high urgency to come up with solutions to create a climate resilient city. Urban ecosystems can play a big role in these solutions and the extinction of biodiversity in the city could be counterproductive. Creating awareness on the values and importance of the natural systems could contribute to sustainable development. Creating a spatial design with interventions that touch upon each of the above stated challenges is therefore relevant on both social, professional and scientific level.
