
# building bonds, building safety

Welcome to the community minga! Together we will build a bamboo pavilion dedicated to women, aimed at enhancing their perception of safety.





## what will you need?

- a group of people ask your friends and neighbours to join the minga!
- tools and safety elements glasses, gloves, a ladder, screwdrivers, drills
- bamboo poles you can order them, prefabricated, from The Best Bamboo
- bamboo 'esterilla' mats to finish the ceiling and the surfaces of the shelves
- rope a strong natural rope, like hemp rope, or another available

- prefabricated foundations you can order them from a local welder
- textiles, flags, paint, yarn, plants, light garlands, ... - for your expression
- prefabricated joints with threaded rods - you can order them from Esteban Morales or a local welder
- green roof elements sugar cane 'EPDM', peach pits, jute bags, cork, substrate, local low plants seedlings you can get them from a local seller

## what's the plan?



## we can learn it all together, with mutual help and experimenting!






### process overview



# you are now ready to start the construction of the pavilion!




3 beams and roof supports

You are ready to start the construction of the bamboo pavilion. When built, it will belong to you and your neighbors, so it is important to plan the management and maintenance.

Certain tasks need to be completed to ensure that the pavilion remains safe, well-functioning and beautiful in the long term. You can choose a dedicated group of leaders or divide the responsibilities between everyone. It is a good idea to plan a maintenance schedule. Here are some of the tasks to consider:

ensuring an inclusive and interesting functional programme by organising meetings, events, etc; tightening lashing connections each year; checking if all bamboo poles are in good condition and replacing broken ones; watering the green roof; cleaning the pavilion. The list can be expanded. Set your own schedule.
