
"DE KLIMKRAMEN"


A co-creative journey to stimulate physical activity of children at the Dapperplein

During the day, children cannot play outside at the Dapperplein in Amsterdam, because it is occupied by a daily market. Through co-creation with children, this project explored ways to use the open space that is revealed in the evening after the market is cleared up, to stimulate children's physical activity.

It was found that the children do not feel safe at the Dapperplein during the evening, because of people that hang out and consume alcohol at the square. Also, their parents often do not allow them to play outside during the evening because of cars that cross at high speed. To address these problems, "De Klimkramen" were created. This design proposes placing playing equipment at the Dapperplein that during the day, with the addition of an awning and board, function as market stalls. This creates a safe playing area, as it forms a physical barrier for traffic, and since it is inviting towards residents, more people will be there to keep an eye out. A sense of community is fostered as it is used in harmony with the market and forms an iconic view for the Dapperplein.



With the addition of a board and awning the design is used as market stall during the day!
