- 1. The success of the mirror imaging method has limited the further exploration of using higher orders of multiples in imaging with OBN data (this thesis).
- 2. Non-linear imaging methods are indispensable for getting more accurate and detailed subsurface images but they tend to get trapped in local minima. Therefore, a hybrid method (combination of non-linear and linear imaging) is mandatory (this thesis).
- 3. With the transition from seismic exploration to economic monitoring of subsurface processes, the use of multiples will be indispensable.
- 4. Marine vibrators will largely replace the air-gun sources.
- 5. Free and accessible mental healthcare services should be a basic human right.
- 6. Gender gap in corporate as well as academic institutions can only be remedied by creating a safer and inclusive space.
- 7. Diversity in leadership does not ensure diversity of opinions unless the status quo is challenged.
- 8. Outsourcing production to benefit from poor worker rights and lower wages is a form of modern slavery.
- 9. Housing should not be a tradeable commodity.
- 10. Metaphors have no place in a scientific conversation.
