Breaking the Cycle: Innovative Residential Solutions for Home-Seeking Youth in Rotterdam			
Katendrecht, east side head of Kaappark			
Homeless youth fall between two stools because they are not entitled to homeless shelters (because of a lack of care need), but they often cannot fall back on their social/family network either. This starts the rollercoaster of couch-sleeping which brings psychological problems and causes young people to drift towards homelessness at a sensitive age. This can cause (health) problems to accumulate.			
How can a residential building facilitate the physical, social, and mental needs of home-seeking youth? Sub-questions 1. What characterizes the social support accessible to youth seeking a stable home? 2. What are the social, physical, and mental needs of home-seeking youth to become self-reliant? 3. What kind of housing concept would be most beneficial for home-seeking youth?			
Design a form of collective housing in Katendrecht where home-seeking youth can form a safe home where they can work on the five pillars of self-reliance.

3.0 methodology

To investigate the needs of home-seeking youth, several methods will be used. To answer the question "What are the physical, social, and mental needs of home-seeking youth?" interviews, workshops, and case studies will be done. The knowledge attained from field research will be strengthened by literature research.

3.1 support system for home seeking youth

First, Research will be done on what kind of housing system this youth is trapped in. To understand the causes and solutions for this target group, it is important to know what they must go through to get proper housing and find the pitfalls in the system. This will be done by researching the governmental and municipal policies and an **interview** will be done with the municipality to get a better understanding of how the policies are applied. Next to that, **Personas** will be created, and the target group will be further explained.

3.2 Needs of home-seeking youth

Interviews will be held with professionals who encounter the target group. An **Interview** is done with a homeless youth shelter for youth with age 18-23. Next to that: a **workshop** is done with youth in Rotterdam, to find out what youth needs surrounding the building and what housing preferences they have. This research will be strengthened by **literature** research to create more knowledge about the different needs of home-seeking youth.

3.3 Desired Housing Concept

To answer the last question "What kind of housing typology would be most beneficial for home-seeking youth?" **interviews** and **case studies** will be done to find different housing concepts for home-seeking youth.
